	<p>Mr. Aniruddha Datta, learned counsel appears for the legal heirs i.e. wife and son of the applicant, since deceased. However, we find from the records that Mr. Datta has not yet filed any vakalatnama to that effect although he had undertaken to do so as indicated in our earlier order dated 11.07.2014. Mrs. Bishnupriya Tripathy, widow of the deceased applicant is also present in person. Mr. Anand Bhandari, learned counsel appears for the respondents.</p> <p>We find from the records that Mr. Datta has not yet taken any step in accordance with our order dated 11.07.2014. At this stage, Mr. Datta submits that he intends to file four applications – (i) for setting aside the abatement of the proceedings before the Hon'ble Orissa High Court ; (ii) praying for substitution of legal heirs; (iii) praying for certain amendment in the cause title as also prayer portion of the application; and (iv) praying for condonation of delay. He further submits that, although all the four separate applications have been made ready but the same are yet to be affirmed and, therefore, he is not in a</p>

position to file the same today. He undertakes to file these applications during the course of the day. He, however, serves an advance copy of all the four applications upon Mr. Bhandari in open court this day.

Mr. Bhandari submits that he would like to file affidavit-in-opposition (A/O) to the application seeking condonation of delay as also to the application praying for setting aside of abatement. For the purpose he prays for three weeks. After due consideration, such prayer of Mr. Bhandari stands allowed. Upon receipt of the A/Os of the respondents as above, Mr. Datta may file affidavit-in-reply thereto, if he is so advised.

In view of the above, let the matter appear for further order on 05.11.2014.

A plain copy of the order, duly countersigned by the Tribunal Officer, be given to the parties upon observance of all usual formalities.
