Mr. Sandip Kumar Bhatacharyya, learned counsel appears for	
the recorded Advocate for the applicant Mr. Suman Basu and prays for	
grant of interim prayer to the effect that the prov	isional pension that was
sanctioned vide PPO No. S/054738/2006 (Arm	y) by the Office of the
Principal CDA(Pension), Allahabad on 12.2.200	7 be given effect to, so
that the immediate suffering of the applicant can	n be addressed. He also
brought to our notice that the applicant who wa	s charged under Section
302/201 IPC was acquitted of the said charges by	y Mrs. K C Barphungpa,
the learned Sessions Judge, Special Division -	I, Sikkim at Gangtok on
29.09.2011. The learned counsel for the applic	eant further prays that in
view of the above, his case be admitted and h	neard as expeditiously as
possible and in the meantime his interim praye	er for commencement of
the provisional pension of his client be allowed.	
It has also been brought to our notice by Mr. Bhattacharyya	
that on the same issue the applicant had repr	resented to the Chief of
Army Staff on 27.01.2012 praying for grant	of provisional pension
sanctioned to him prior to his acquittal on 29.	.09.2011. We find from
records that although such representation wa	as sent in the month of
January, 2012, till date no response has been	received although more
than six months have elapsed.	

No counsel appears for the respondents. However, Lt. Col. Mukul Dev from Legal Cell, HQ Bengal Area enters appearance and submits that the recorded advocate in this case Mr. Souvik Nandy could not appear this day due to his personal problem.

With due consideration to the sufferings of the applicant, who, as per present status, stands acquitted of the criminal charges, cannot be denied of his pension, if otherwise eligible. After perusal of documents like the provisional PPO and the Sessions Court judgement acquitting the applicant, which are not contested by the opponent, the interim prayer made by the applicant and submission made by Mr. Bhattacharyya in this regard was heard by us.

We grant relief to the applicant with regards to such interim prayer and the respondents are directed to abide by the provisional PPO as mentioned above that has been sanctioned with effect from the date of its issuance. The dues that would accrue on such provisional PPO be paid to the applicant within 30 days from the date of receipt of this order.

Since no affidavit in opposition has been filed as yet, the matter is fixed for 21.12.2012 for further order. The affidavits be exchanged in the meantime.
